Interested parties wishing to attend are requested to submit the names of participants (not exceeding two persons) no later than Thursday, 16 October 2025. All interested parties are kindly requested to follow updates on the investigation process regularly through the same website.

Furthermore, interested parties who wish to make oral statements are requested to prepare their statements in writing, together with supporting evidence, to be submitted on Monday, 20 October 2025. Should additional information be presented orally beyond that already submitted in writing, and the presenter wishes such information to be considered as part of the evidence, the presenter shall submit the additional written comments, evidence, or documents to the Department of Foreign Trade within three (3) working days from the date of the Public Hearing, i.e., no later than 23 October 2025 at 4:30 p.m. (Bangkok Time).

In the event that any evidence, documents, or comments submitted contain information deemed confidential, you are required to provide a non-confidential summary that can be disclosed to other interested parties, in accordance with the Article 21 of Safeguard Measures on Increased Imports Act B.E. 2550 (A.D.2007). Rules of Oral Hearing Procedure

The initiation of a safeguard investigation concerning the increased imports of

Polypropylene and the injury

1. The Department of Foreign Trade will not respond to any questions raised by interested parties during the hearing.
2. Interested parties who wish to make oral statements are requested to prepare their statements in writing, together with supporting evidence, to be submitted on Monday, 20 October 2025. Should additional information be presented orally beyond that already submitted in writing, and the presenter wishes such information to be considered as part of the evidence, the presenter shall submit the additional written comments, evidence, or documents to the Department of Foreign Trade within three (3) working days from the date of the Public Hearing, i.e., no later than 23 October 2025 at 4:30 p.m. (Bangkok Time).
3. Oral presentations shall be conducted in Thai language only. However, foreign interested parties may make their presentations in English.
4. Each interested party shall be allowed no more than **10 minutes** for oral presentation. The order of presentations will be announced in the meeting.
5. Oral statements must be presented individually within the allotted time. If the presentation exceeds the allocated time, the speaker may be instructed to conclude the presentation.
6. The Department of Foreign Trade will record the proceedings of the hearing.
7. The Department of Foreign Trade reserves the right to amend, modify, or supplement these rules and procedures during the hearing as deemed appropriate.
